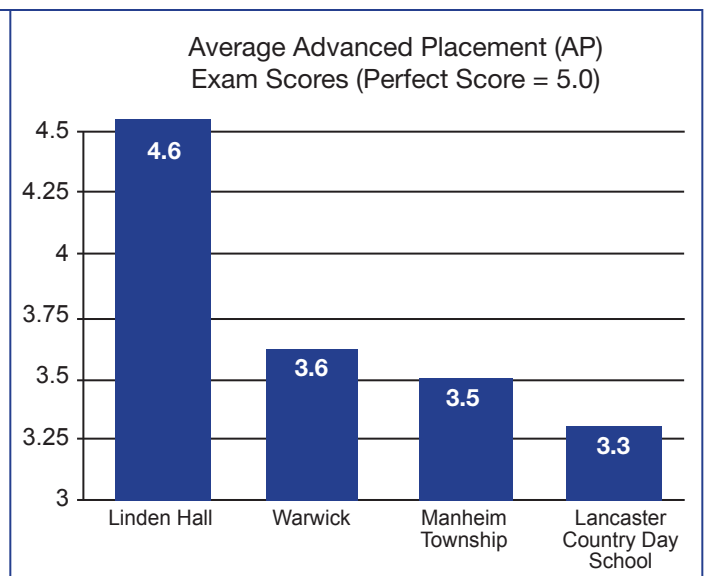
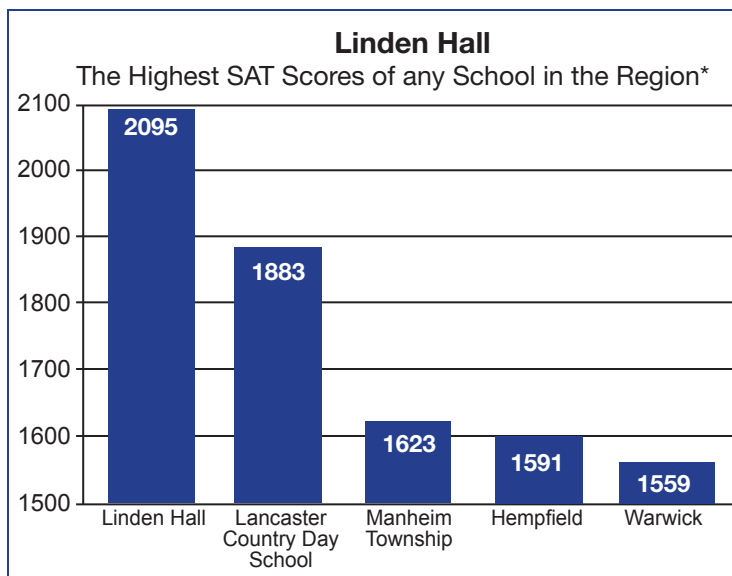

Linden Hall is committed to offering an exceptional college-preparatory experience. Our community values scholarly achievement, character development, cultural awareness, and physical wellness. Linden Hall's average SAT score of 2095, average SAT 2 subject matter test of 720, and average Advanced Placement (AP) Exam score of 4.6 are each the highest of any school in the region or the nation.

Accreditations:

The School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The school holds membership in the National Association of Independent Schools and the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Schools.

Equestrian Program:

Linden Hall's championship equestrian program is designed to meet the needs of riders from recreational beginners to advanced competitors. The focus of instruction is Huntseat Equitation and Jumper. The team competes in Interscholastic Equitation Association (IEA) and United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) rated events.
