It was a great place to come of age, be challenged academically, and be supported by everyone on staff. My favorite memories are from every fall when school started - reconnecting with everyone, and catching up. Those were the days before constant social media and email, and few of us had cell phones! Ok, the dances at Valley Forge were a lot of fun, too.

How many years did you attend Linden Hall?

Five, though one year was spent as an exchange student in Japan.

I tried a number of things from Yearbook and echo staff, to riding and softball. I also played volleyball for LH and was a competitive swimmer at a local club. I also learned how to juggle in a random club offering. That was another great thing about LH - you could try anything you wanted to!
